Takamiyagi Hiroshi (b. 1940) has practiced Shuri-Te Karate under Nakamura Ankichi since 1960; he opened his first dojo in 1981 in Chatan, Okinawa. As a writer, researcher, and historian, Takamiyagi Sensei has always actively pursued the roots of Okinawa's Budo; in the early 1980's, his research brought him to Singapore to study and learn the art of Nan Shaolin Wu Zhu Chuan (Five Ancestor Fist) or 'Minami Shorin Go So Ken' in Japanese language. His teacher in Singapore was Koh Nai Kheng, and was introduced by Koh Sifu's student, Mr Lee Chee Ngai, who was living in Okinawa at the time.

Takamiyagi Sensei began teaching both Shuri-Te and Wu Zhu Quan together under the banner of Goshukan-Ryu, while keeping the two arts distinctly separate.

Since 1981, Takamiyagi Sensei has operated his dojo in Hamagawa, Sunabe-Okinawa, and continues to research and train both Wu Zhu Quan and Dento Shuri-Te Karate.
